GUIDELINES FOR SUBMITTING ABSTRACTS:

We are welcoming abstracts from now until March 31, 2019.

Abstracts Guidelines: Abstracts should be no more than 500 words and can be submitted via e-mail to info@professionalbiology.com. **Please email with the subject line: “APB Conference 2019 Abstract Submission”**. Please provide your name, contact information and affiliation.

Presentation Guidelines: Final Presentations should be formatted in MS Power Point 2010 or higher or PDF and be no longer than 20 minutes. Presentations which can be available for distribution (as PDF’s) as part of conference proceedings will be given preference over those with proprietary restrictions. The deadline for all submissions is March 31, 2019. Late submissions will only be considered if any spaces remain or there are cancellations.

Adjudication Process: As there are a limited number of plenary slots available the APB conference committee will be adjudicating presentation abstracts themes based on relevance to the conference theme and currency of subject matter and topic. This year’s conference is only one day, so competition will be tight.
